\$1 a day will provide two weeks of groceries for a family of 5 living in a shelter due to domestic violence in the home.

\$3 a day provides 75 hours of tutoring for a non-English speaking student who needs to develop communication skills, find employment, and achieve citizenship.

\$3 a day will provide 21 sessions of therapy to victims of sexual violence or other traumatic crime.

\$1 a week provides 5 youth the supplies and instruction needed for an after-school STEM activity such as rocket construction or a planting project.

\$1 a day will provides seven days of shelter, food, counseling and job training for a homeless veteran.



\$1 per day provides one year of supplies and supervision for 20 members in the Project Learn after school program funded by United Way.

\$5 a month will allow 50 patients with no insurance to receive free medical services and prescription medicines.

\$10 per month will provide free prescription medicines for 1 senior who might otherwise have to choose between buying needed medication and buying groceries.
